2023 has been a busy year for ACCPF. We proudly launched The Outdoor Connection, Napa County's first mobile trailside learning center. After an Earth Day unveiling, we served the Boys and Girls Club and City of American Canyon Summer Camps with hands-on environmental programs at Wetlands. We launched the free "Discovery Days" series, bringing youth and their families together at the Wetlands to learn about endangered and threatened wetlands wildlife, their habitats, and how to protect them.

As we celebrate our eighth year as a nonprofit, all eyes are on the future and our new home, the Napa River Ecology Center. This multibenefit project opens new public access to wetlands, supports climate change resiliency, expands environmental partnerships, and allows us to quadruple program capacity. ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION



In 2023, every 4th grader in the American Canyon schools became a Watershed Explorer. This three-part program turns the Wetlands Edge trailhead into an outdoor classroom, connecting kids to nature and improving the environment. **Through this program, over 300 students participated in immersive learning experiences** focused on healthy ecosystems, water quality, life cycles of plants and animals, and the impact of human activities on our surrounding habitats.













Since April 2023, The Outdoor Connection, a state-of-the-art mobile classroom, has held 9 community events and 3 summer camps, with **over 1,300 hours of outdoor learning and exploration**. Program participants explore nature and the environment while utilizing microscopes and binoculars, engaging in nature-based art creation, and learning from environmental educators. New Discovery Days trailside programs will highlight different environmental themes throughout 2024.


TEEN PLAY TEAM




Wetlands Coffee Mornings

ACCPF's quarterly Coffee Mornings continues to be a member favorite. This free trailside program highlights the Napa River Wetlands and encourages the community to get outside and enjoy nature. Featuring FREE coffee, in partnership with Starbucks American Canyon locations, ACCPF's Coffee Mornings are a popular place to catch up with neighbors, enjoy some outdoor recreation, and take in the beautiful wetland's scenery.

Community Hikes

ACCPF brings the community together for free social and educational hikes. The 2023 series included the introduction of a King Tides social hike, a spring Wetlands Photography Hike in partnership with the American Canyon Chamber of Commerce, a Pollinators Hike at Newell Open Space led by our partners at Napa Resource Conservation District, and Full Moon Walk along the Wetlands Edge Trail in October.

Earth Day

Earth Day American Canyon brought together five of ACCPF's environmental partners, The City of American Canyon and the Napa Valley Community College for a celebration at the Wetlands Edge trailhead. Sponsored by Marin Clean Energy, the event featured hands-on learning opportunities for all ages on topics such as personal composting, green transportation, personal wellness checks, sea level rise, and the unveiling of ACCPF's mobile classroom.

100 Hours Outside

The 100 Hours Outside Challenge returned for its second year in the summer of 2023. Thanks to the support of business sponsors, the 100 Hours Outside Challenge allowed **84** community members to participate FREE of charge, resulting in over 4,030 hours spent outside! The top participant completed **212** hours outside. Way to go!





13th Annual Reindeer Run

The Reindeer Run 5k/10k is a beloved tradition for many in American Canyon and beyond. Featuring a festive race atmosphere and a visit from Santa & his reindeer, this community event continues to grow in popularity drawing runners from all over the Bay Area and even its first international runner this year! With a record attendance of 548 participants, the Reindeer Run highlights the Napa River Wetlands while raising funds for community nature programs.

Heart Your Parks

In 2023 Heart Your Parks moved to the American Canyon trails. Eleven amazing artists created environmental-themed heart frames for community members to enjoy while hiking Newell Open Space, Wetlands Edge Linear Trail, and the Napa River & Bay Trail.

In 2023, we made steady progress toward developing the Napa River Ecology Center. This unique repurpose project provides a future home for the Foundation allowing us to quadruple program capacity to meet the growing needs of youth and the environment. 
